Purpose

Pediatric behavioral health care presents unique ethical challenges, both in advancing knowledge through research and in applying current scientific understanding. This conference will explore the interrelatedness of physical, emotional and behavioral health in children, with special emphasis on the contributions of ethics in integrating these aspects of health in guiding action for complex situations of diagnosis, treatment and research.

Practical problems such as prescribing psychotropic medications, dealing with disrupted family relationships, communicating confidential behavior-related information and improving access to behavioral health care will be addressed.

Target Audience

This conference will be of interest to those who serve in the health professions, and to those who work in any organization, institution or network that provides services to children and their families. This will be an opportunity to share insights from many perspectives on how behavioral health services can be better understood and coordinated.



Objectives

Upon completion of this conference, participants should be able to:

- Explore the impact of modern social change on children's behavior.
- Examine how clinical ethics consultation can help clarify a course of action when behavioral issues interfere with decision making.
- Reflect on current problems in prescribing psychotropic medication in children.
- Discuss issues related to performing research in pediatric behavioral health care.
- Describe the need for and methods of providing communication of confidential behavioral health information.
- Review proposed solutions for improving access to behavioral health services for children.
