About LC Behavioral Health Services

- 2018 Voter-Approved Ballot Initiative: 20-Year funding stream generated from sales-and-use tax designated for behavioral health
- Community Master Plan: Used to create the framework for the initiative. Master Plan 2.0 will re-evaluate community needs.

Impact Fund Grant Program

- Directly (re)invest in community behavioral health services
- Community-Informed decision-making through three advisory groups that include elected officials, behavioral health professionals, individuals with lived experience, and a Commissioner liaison.
- Advisory groups define Targeted Grants for focused funding

Behavioral Health Services at Longview Campus

- Services defined through the Community Master Plan
- First Building: Acute Care - To address the critical need for crisis services in our community

Future Initiatives

- Bridge Fund: Address barriers to care such as financial, ancillary services, transportation, etc.
- Phase II for the Longview Campus
